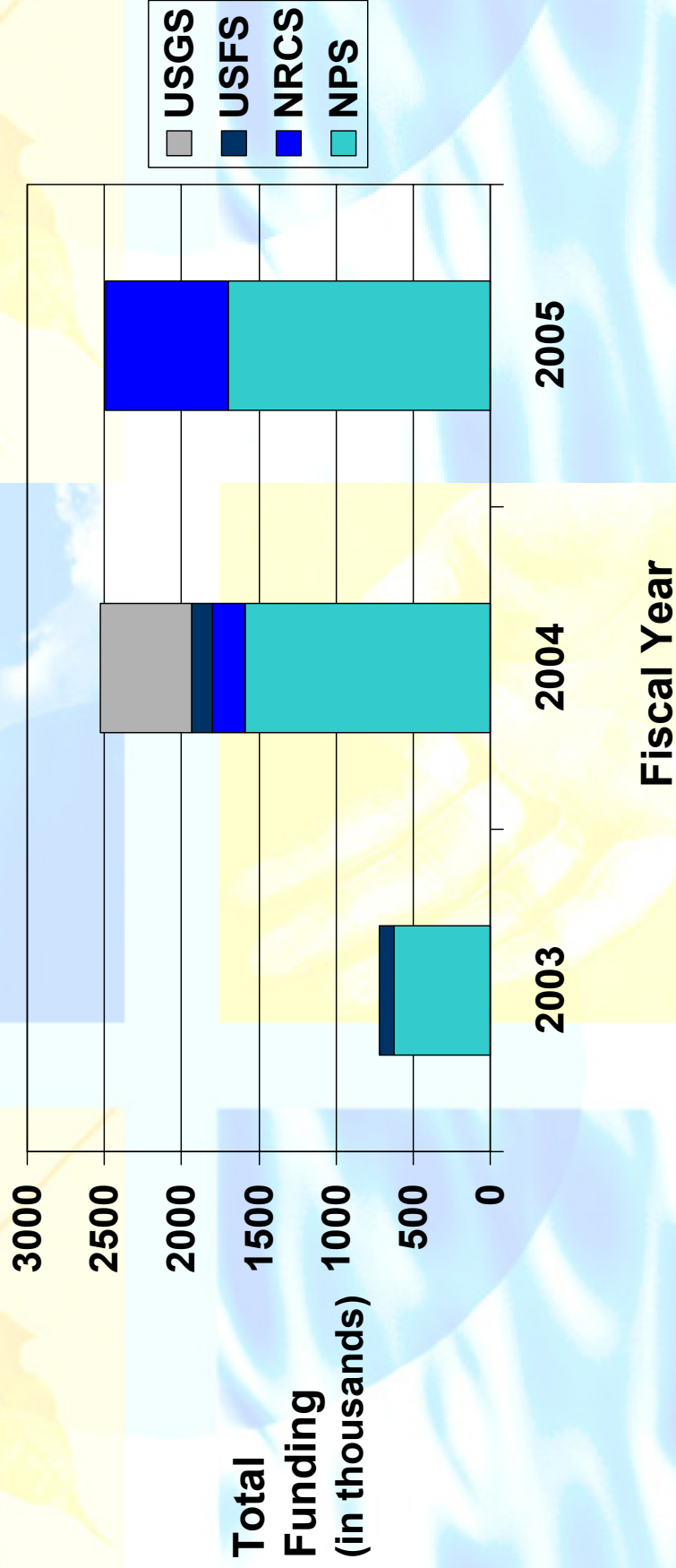


Overview of GLNF CESU

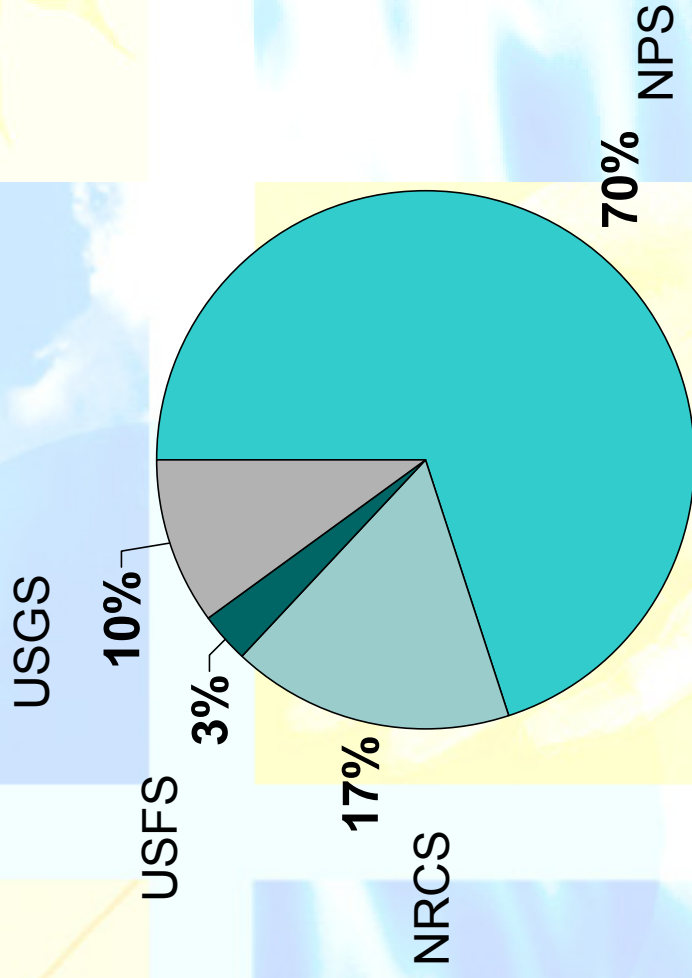

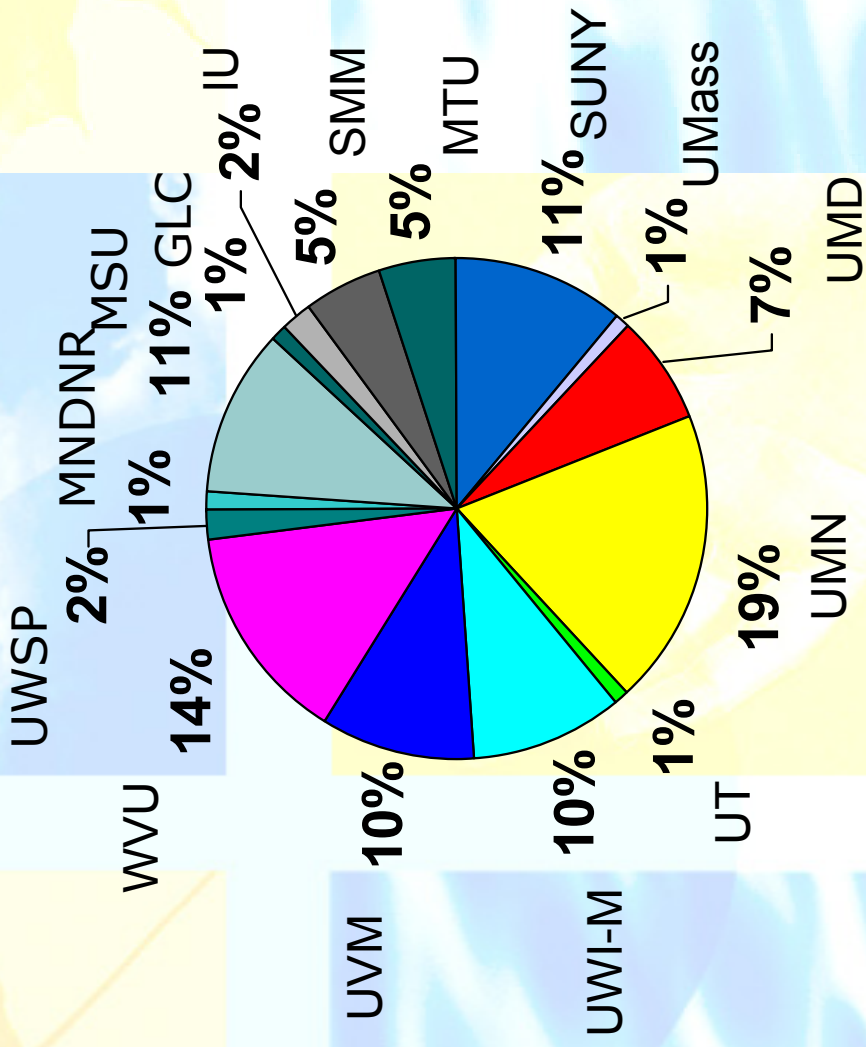
Funding by Agency: FY03 - 05

Draft Annual Work Plan: 2006

- Update expertise database
- Revamp website and expertise information
- Collect agency information to complete a searchable research needs catalog
- Develop marketing CD for tech reps to get greater involvement across agencies and partners (*just beginning*)
- Facilitate identification of multi-agency, ecosystem based project(s)
- Increase communication/interaction with the GLNF-CESU minority partners
- Collaborate with NASA grant office on using cooperative agreements
- Work with USFS staff on improving ease of use for CESU agreements
- Look for a opportunities to engage the USFWS and work towards possible induction
- Continue work on congressional funding for CESUs
- Prepare cooperative agreement renewal materials!



2006 Highlights to Date

- US Army Corps of Engineers joining
- First task agreement with
 - Northern Michigan University (NPS)
 - "Develop Geoarcheological Inventory of Specific Lakeshore Landforms at Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore"
- 29 NPS task agreements in progress for approximately \$830,000
- All agencies inform host about projects
